



From Copenhagen to Helsinki Best Practices Supporting European Cooperation in VET

4th December 2006 in Marina Congress Center, Helsinki, Finland

Invitation

The Finnish Leonardo da Vinci National Agency in CIMO in co-operation with the Ministry of Education in Finland and the European Commission will organise a European conference on the 4th December 2006 in Marina Congress Center, Helsinki, Finland.

The conference is organised, with the goal of highlighting the importance of the Leonardo da Vinci programme as a testing field for the strategies and priorities for European cooperation in VET (the Copenhagen Process).

The Copenhagen Process aims at enhanced cooperation in European vocational education and training. It underlines the important role VET has to play in order European Union to achieve the goal to become the most competitive and dynamic knowledge-based economy in the world.

The aims and priorities of this process were agreed in the Copenhagen Declaration adopted in December 2002 by the education Ministers of 31 European countries, social partners and the European Commission. More recently, further actions were outlined in the Maastricht communiqué adopted in December 2004. Now, during the Finnish Presidency in 2006, the aim is to follow-up the current situation in the member states and set the agenda for the future development areas.

The Leonardo da Vinci programme supports these European processes at several levels. At the moment a number of projects are dealing with the various priorities set in the Copenhagen process. The priorities during the Calls for proposals 2005-2006 were also closely linked with the Maastricht Communiqué.

AIMS

The conference will take stock of links between policies, as outlined in the Copenhagen Declaration and Maastricht Communiqué, and practice as displayed in Leonardo-projects and emphasise the key role of Leonardo da Vinci programme in developing, testing and implementing tools and practices for European cooperation in VET.

Also, since the pre-call notice including priorities for Leonardo da Vinci proposals for 2007 is expected to be published in October 2006, the conference will be able to look concretely at how the Copenhagen process can be addressed during the next call.

The conference will supplement the Ministerial Meeting taking place on 4-5 December in Helsinki. This Ministerial Meeting is, after Maastricht 2004, the second follow-up meeting of the Copenhagen process and is expected to issue a Helsinki Communiqué, reviewing the priorities and strategies for the Copenhagen process. The Communiqué, to be issued on 5 December, will be based on Council Conclusions accepted earlier in November 2006. The conference will therefore also be in good position to look at future priorities and strategies for European cooperation in VET as outlined in the Council Conclusions and will highlight key areas of interest VET providers and project promoters within the Copenhagen process.



Furthermore, the conference will showcase the 10 projects that during the Ministerial Meeting will be receiving the Helsinki Awards for best practice projects contributing to the aims of the Copenhagen process.

Whilst the Ministerial Meeting will take place on the highest political level with restricted attendance, this conference "From Copenhagen to Helsinki" is aimed at a broader audience and to all practitioners in vocational education and training:

- -Teachers and researchers in VET
- Promoters of projects with links to the Copenhagen process
- Future promoters of projects under these themes
- Policy makers
- Social partners
- Leonardo da Vinci National Agencies
